## Pap Smear Provider Module For Practice Nurses

Facilitator: Family Planning Queensland  
This Program is accredited with RCNA



### Course Objective:

To provide an opportunity for registered nurses to develop cervical screening practice skills. The workshop may also be applicable to enrolled nurses and health workers.

### Course Content:

To successfully complete the FPQ Pap Smear Provider Module, participants must complete the theory component and clinical attachment.

### Theory Component:

Participants are required to

- attend a three-day face-to-face theory course.
- submit a completed theory workbook (to be completed within 6 months of the theory component).

### Clinical attachment component:

The clinical attachment is to be completed within 6 months of the theory course and can be undertaken in FPQ clinics in Brisbane, Ipswich, Toowoomba, Townsville, Cairns, and Rockhampton. Other options may be negotiated for a limited number of participants. A minimum of 2-3 days' clinical supervision is required, with a minimum of 15 Pap smears performed.

### Assessment requirements are:

1. Completion of Theory Workbook
2. Completion of Clinical Workbook
3. Demonstration of additional readings
4. Case Study

### **Triple P (Parenting) Program**

Triple P has been developed and scientifically proven over 30 years by The University of Queensland Parent and Family Support Centre. The system is widely in use throughout Australia and increasingly, throughout the world. You'll learn about; effective parenting strategies; how to promote your child's development; how to manage common child behaviour problems and principles to help parents deal with almost any situation that might arise.

Triple P Level 4 Standard program will be completed across eight weeks of one hour consultations. Subsequent to the implementation of the group sessions, individual sessions are available for continued support. The program will involve assessments of child's behaviour and feedback regarding your parenting style. These aspects will be assessed prior to, and upon completion of training in order to track parent and child's personal progress. The program is presented by Melissa Reardon, Registered Psychologist
